Biography: DONALD V. GAYTON

Donald V. Gayton, operations manager for the United States Pavilion at HemisFair '68, joined the U.S. Department of Commerce in 1963, following his association with Century 21, the World's Fair in Seattle, Washington.

Since then, he has managed many of the U.S. trade promotion exhibitions staged by the Department at international trade fairs abroad. In 1967 he managed the U.S. exhibitions at the Machine Tool Exposition, Melbourne, Australia, and the International Trade Fair, Accra, Ghana.

Born in Tiverton, Rhode Island, Mr. Gayton received the bachelor's degree from the University of Washington, Seattle, in 1941. He is married and has a son serving in the Peace Corps in Colombia, South America.

Biography: SAEED KHAN

Saeed Khan, protocol/press officer for the United States Pavilion at HemisFair '68, joined the U.S. Expositions Staff of the U.S. Department of Commerce in December 1967.

Previously with the Department of State, he was assigned as protocol officer to the Seattle World's Fair in 1961-62 and to the New York World's Fair in 1963-65. In 1966-67 he served as U.S. Foreign Service Officer at the United States Pavilion at Expo '67 in Montreal.

Born in Pakistan, Mr. Khan is a graduate of Cambridge University and the Pakistan Military Academy.

He was commissioned in the 6th Bengal Lancers and served as a military aide to two presidents of Pakistan. He came to the United States in 1956 to work in the Department of State.
